As well as working with Electively Home-educated children, Fast Progress Tuition also works with the LA and schools to support their students back into education. Most of our students have SEN needs, are vulnerable and suffer from anxiety. We ensure that every student we educate achieves successful outcomes Post-16.

We are not a Tutoring agency. We are a supportive student focused and student-led Education Family who has our student's emotional well-being at the forefront of everything we do.

A successful applicant may mentor at the Centre, in public places or at a student's home.

Being a Nurture Mentor is a privilege. They work closely with students and their families when they are most vulnerable due to struggling with social, emotional or behavioural problems that affect their ability to learn and function in school and society. . The role of a Nurture Mentor is to be part of the initial introduction to Fast Progress Tuition and develop strong, trusting relationships with the student and child, remembering that some of our children distrust adults, especially teachers. They provide their mentees with fresh perspectives and independent points of view, whilst guiding them through a process that fosters growth and educational development. They are the child's point of first contact, and will play a huge part of their transition into the centre, if they are too anxious to leave their home, and will remain with their mentee until they are ready to be handed across to our Pathway Mentors who will focus on their reintegration back to school or onto their Post-16 pathways.

All of our Mentors work alongside teachers and other staff at the centre, and will help establish the emotional needs of students and how they result in barriers to learning that are preventing them from achieving their full potential.

Fast Progress Tuition (FPT) is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment. The successful candidate will be subject to an enhanced DBS check and satisfactory references.
